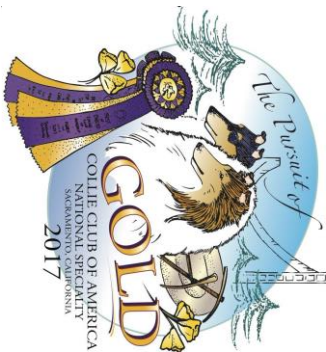

ENTRY INFORMATION: Entry fee is \$35 for the first entry, per dog, per day, \$20 for the second and third entry of the same dog, per day, (includes \$3.50/\$3 AKC recording fee per entry). Mail all entries with fees (checks or money orders only) **payable to Collie Club of America** to: Mary Roseberry, PO Box 2723, Fair Oaks, CA 95628. Returned checks will incur a \$25 fee. A maximum of ten (10) dogs may be submitted per envelope of entries. *Entries that are incorrect, illegible, or incomplete will not be accepted and will be returned to the exhibitor.* **Express mail entries must waive the signature requirement or they will be refused.**

Exhibitors are responsible for complete, accurate and legible information on their entry forms. All illegible or incomplete forms may be returned without prior notification to the exhibitor. Trial secretary assumes no responsibility for incorrect entry information due to illegibility of the entry. Entries will not be accepted without proper fees and signatures. Entries must be submitted on entry forms with the AKC agreement printed on the reverse side. Entries submitted without the agreement will be returned. If any exhibitor wishes to know that he made it into the trial, he must either include a valid email address on the entry form (preferred) or include a self-addressed stamped postcard or envelope.

REFUNDS: Entry fees will not be refunded in the event that a dog is absent, excused, disqualified or barred from the competition by action of the Show Committee. No entry fees will be refunded if the trial cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, or any other cause beyond control of the organizing committee. Entry fees will not be returned after the closing date for any reason with the following exception: bitches that come in season may have their entry fee returned, less an \$8.00 per day administrative fee, by sending a signed statement from veterinarian, on their letterhead, to the Trial Secretary by 8:00 a.m. the day of the Trial.

NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS: It is expressly understood that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children. Any exhibitor whose dogs and/or children create unnecessary disturbances or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the Trial Committee, be asked to leave the trial site. In such case, no refund of any fees paid will be made.

All handlers must pick up after their dogs. Anyone not cleaning up after his or her dog will be requested to leave the trial. The owner/handler of each dog is solely responsible for having it ready at ringside when the class is to be judged. Please help your fellow competitors, the trial workers, and the judge by checking in with the gate steward well ahead of your run, and being prompt at the line when your turn comes to run.

ARBITRATION: This club does not agree to arbitrate claims as set forth on the official AKC entry form for this event.

HEIGHT DIVISIONS: Owners are responsible for entering the proper height divisions. Handlers may opt to run in a higher height division in the Regular program, but not in a lower division than their proper height division. Handlers must run in their proper height division in the Preferred program.

Dogs that run in a height division lower than their proper division will be eliminated

DOGS ELIGIBLE TO ENTER: All collies fifteen (15) months of age or older that are registered with the American Kennel Club or that have AKC Limited Registration, Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP) are eligible to participate, except bitches in season, aggressive dogs, or dogs suffering from any deformity, injury, or illness which may affect the dog's physical or mental performance. Refer to Chapter 2 of the Registration and Discipline Rules for the listing of registerable breeds that may participate.

SAFETY: The safety of the dogs is our primary concern. By entering this trial, exhibitors acknowledge that they are familiar with the rules and regulations of this sport, and that their dogs are familiar with and able to perform all obstacles safely.

COURSE FAMILIARIZATION/OBSTACLES: Handlers are permitted to walk the course, without a dog, prior to the start of the class. A walk-through period will be held prior to each class. The walk-through may be split at the judge's discretion. The judges briefing will outline the course and answer handler questions. Obstacles will meet the specifications for obstacles in the current edition of the regulations for Agility Trials. **There will be no contact familiarization for Novice dogs at these trials.**

CRATING AND SETUP: There is room under cover for set ups, however the arena is partially open on two ends, so dress appropriately. **There will be a few chairs available, but it is highly recommended that you bring your own, also bring crates and/or x-pens for your dog(s).** Setup begins 7 a.m. Monday. No setup allowed on Sunday.

CATALOGS: A catalog will be provided to each exhibitor at no charge.

Exhibitors should follow their veterinarians' recommendation to assure their dogs are free of internal and external parasites, any communicable diseases, and have appropriate vaccinations.

MOVE-UP REGULATIONS: Dogs may be moved up to a higher class at the request of the owner, as a result of qualifying for an agility title, provided that the request is made in writing to the trial secretary only. Forms may be mailed to Mary Roseberry, PO Box 2723, Fair Oaks, CA 95628, or emailed to marybery@comcast.net. No phone move-ups.

Pretrial move-ups (for either day) must be received by the trial secretary by 6:00 p.m. Monday, March 13, 2017.

Day to day move-ups are offered, and must be received by the trial secretary in writing at the trial site by the end of ribbon awards on Monday, March 20, 2017.

Dogs so moved up will be entered at the end of the running order, and every effort will be made to accommodate handlers running multiple dogs the same class. *A dog which has been entered in a Novice "A" class for which it is not eligible to be entered in due to class restrictions on the dog or handler may be moved to the Novice "B" class under the following conditions: The request for the move must be in writing and presented to the superintendent or trial secretary at least 30 minutes prior to the start of each trial. The request must state the reason and justification for the move from a Novice "A" class to the Novice "B" class.*

Move-ups must be made in writing - verbal requests will not be accepted. Email move-ups are acceptable. Return forms to the Trial Secretary only.

In addition to the Host Hotel and others listed on the National Specialty Web site, there are three LaQuintas, two Motel 6s and two Red Roof Inns within 15 miles of the main show site at Cal Expo.

DIRECTIONS: From the Hilton Host Hotel on Harvard Street:

Turn **left** onto **Arden Way** – travel for .33 miles
Turn **left** to take the take **I-80 Bus W/I-80 Bus E ramp** for .1 miles
Merge onto **I-80 Bus W/Capital City Freeway W** via the ramp on the left toward San Francisco.
After 4.56 miles I-80 W/Capital City Frwy W becomes CA-99 S.
Continue on **CA-99 S** for 11 miles
Take the **Elk Grove Blvd** exit, **EXIT 286**
Turn **right** onto **Elk Grove Blvd** – travel 1.53 miles to Bruceville Rd
Turn **left** onto **Bruceville Rd** – travel 3.3 miles
Turn **left** at the entrance to Western Agility Group (WAG)
The entrance will be .7 miles past Kammerer Road, just past a large solar panel installation and marked with a large wooden sign.

From Interstate 5 go east on Elk Grove Blvd to Bruceville Rd. turn right [south] go approximately 3.5miles. Driveway on left. Large sign at entrance go to the rear of property.

****Please drive very slowly on the entrance road into the facility****
We MUST obey the posted speed limit signs, 10mph on long driveway and 5 mph near the arena.

PRIZES AND AWARDS: Dogs must qualify to receive awards. Qualifying rosettes will be awarded to all dogs receiving a qualifying score. Placement rosettes will be awarded for 1st through 4th place in each class in each height division. New title rosettes will be awarded to dogs completing an agility title at this trial. All prizes must be claimed at the trial; none will be mailed. Additional special prizes will be available and are described below.

A MACH / PACH bar and rosette will be provided for dogs earning these respective titles at the show. Dogs receiving a PAX title will receive a rosette. Please contact Trial Secretary Mary Roseberry at marybery@comcast.net if you think you may complete one of these titles at this trial.

High In Trial: An Agility themed sculpture by Laura Weiss will be awarded for High in Trial each day.

COLLIE HIT AGILITY DOG - AWARD SELECTION PROCESS

CCA will offer one High in Trial (HIT) agility award each day at the National Specialty.

Only qualifying scores from the regular Standard and Jumpers with Weaves (JWW) classes count towards HIT. Preferred classes and additional classes, such as FAST and T2B, do not count towards HIT.

For purposes of the HIT award, a "double Q" is defined as qualifying in both Standard and JWW, any level, or a combination of levels, on a single day of the agility trial.

Classes are weighted as follows:

- Novice classes receive 90% of their score
- Open classes receive 95%, and
- Excellent/Masters receive 100%.

Additionally, collies receive one point for each full second under standard course time (SCT).

The HIT award is calculated by adding the weighted score of each of a collie's qualifying runs (Standard and JWW) plus one point for each full second under standard course time (SCT). The collie with the highest total score under this formula wins the HIT award.

If no collie earns a "double Q," then the HIT award will be determined by calculating only the weighted score for Standard runs plus one point for each full second under SCT for the Standard run.

In the event of a tie, the tie will be broken on the basis of the fastest yards per second (YPS) achieved in any run counted towards the HIT by the tied collies.

MOST VERSATILE COLLIE IN THE 2017 NATIONAL SPECIALTY SHOW

To be eligible for this award a Collie must participate in at least three of the four AKC events offered by the CCA (Breed, Obedience/Rally, Agility or Herding). Sign up for the award at any performance event. You must sign up for the award to be eligible, and signup sheets must be turned in to Beth Elliott by the end of the agility trial. The detailed rules for determining the winner from the Collies that qualify for the award are given below. Note that weighting factors are used in each of the performance events to recognize the increased difficulty of the higher level classes. In the Non-Best of Variety classes, points are awarded based on the number of dogs defeated in the class. All scores will be recorded from the posted Judge's sheets. Beth Elliott will maintain the official scores at this show. The

award presentations will be announced on Saturday, March 25, 2017 in the main conformation ring (Time TBA).

MOST VERSATILE COLLIE PRIZES

Most Versatile Collie in Show -- CCA 15" Silver Plated Loving Cup, Large Rosette and Ceramic sculpture by Laura Weiss

Most Versatile Collie Qualifiers – Qualifying Rosette and Memento Item

RULES FOR THE MOST VERSATILE COLLIE AWARD

To be eligible for this award, your Collie needs a qualifying score in at least three of the four AKC events at the National Specialty. A Collie that receives MVC points in Breed is considered to have received a qualifying score in that event. Only one score will be counted for each event. The Collie obtaining the highest point total will win the award. The following scoring system will apply:

Breed:

- All Collies that are a conformation champion or have at least 5 championship points will receive a minimum of 40 MVC points for entering and showing in a conformation class at the CCA National.
- Collies with less than 5 Championship points will not automatically receive any MVC points for showing in a conformation class. Points will only be awarded for placing in a class and defeating competition.
- Since this is an individual award, Brace Class performance do not count. No points will be awarded to Collies entering a conformation class and not showing (i.e. marked absent).
- In the BOV class and winners competition, points will be awarded as follows:
 - Making no cuts: 40 points
 - Making first cut: 50 points
 - Making second cut: 60 points
 - Making third cut: 70 points
 - Awards of Merit: 80 points
 - Select Dog or Bitch: 85 points
 - Reserve Winners: 75 points
 - Winners: 80 points
 - Best of Winners: 85 points
 - BOS to BOV: 90 points
 - Best of Variety: 100 points

- In all other conformation classes, points will be awarded based on the number of dogs defeated in that class as follows:
- No placement: 40 points for conformation Champions and Collies with 5 or more CH points
0 points for Collies with less than 5 CH points
- Placements: Two (2) additional points are awarded for every dog defeated in the class up to a maximum total number of 70 MVC points. (Collies with less than 5 CH points will also receive the base 40 MVC points for placing and defeating dogs in a class).

Herding Test and Trial: (No points are awarded for Herding Instinct or Exhibition Only entries)

- Herding Tested Class: Passing: 50 points
- Pre-Trial Tested Class: Passing: 50 points
- Started Trial Class: 90% of total score (out of 100)
- Intermediate Trial Class: 95% of total score (out of 100)
- Advanced Trial Class: 100% of total score (out of 100)

Obedience & Rally Trial: (Since this is an individual award, Brace Class Performances do not count.)

- Beginner Novice: 40% of total score (out of 200)
- Preferred Novice: 43% of total score (out of 200)
- Novice and Veteran: 45% of total score (out of 200)
- Graduate Novice: 46% of total score (out of 200)
- Open and Preferred Open: 47% of total score (out of 200)
- Graduate Open: 48% of total score (out of 200)
- Utility and Preferred Utility: 50% of total score (out of 200)
- Rally Novice: 60% of total score (out of 100)
- Rally Advanced: 75% of total score (out of 100)
- Rally Excellent: 90% of total score (out of 100)

Agility Trial:

Standard and JWW Classes, both Regular and preferred:

- Novice: 90% of total score (out of 100)
- Open: 95% of total score (out of 100)
- Excellent: 100% of total score (out of 100)
- FAST: 125% of total score (out of 80)
- Time2Beat: 95% (90 + T2B points earned)
