Northern California is thrilled to welcome the Collie Club of America to our state capitol, Sacramento, in 2017. We know we can offer an exciting National, which will be built around the exhibitors. We hope that all the Collie fanciers will head west in their "Pursuit of Gold."

The venue that we will use to host our event is **Cal Expo**, which is settled on 350 acres. Cal Expo is located in the heart of the city and is regarded as the most accessible and consumer friendly venue in the area. This facility is home to our State fair as well as hosting the Sacramento Kennel Club all breed shows. Cal Expo Harness Racing and Sports & Wagering Center is also located on the property. The building that will be used is **The Pavilion** (98,000 sq. ft.). The Pavilion is fully heated and air-conditioned. The building will allow us to have all conformation, obedience, rally, grooming and vendors all in one building.

The grounds around the Pavilion have an abundance of large grassy areas and plenty of walking areas. All overnight parking will be right by the Pavilion building with full hook ups. http://www.calexpo.com/

The host hotel for the event will be the **Red Lion Hotel, Woodlake**, which is less than a mile from the show site. The Red Lion has given us a price of **\$95.00 per night** per room. All rooms are equipped with **sleep number beds** and many of the down stairs rooms have double access into the rooms from the parking area and out to the center of the courtyard. The hotel is **extremely dog friendly** and is host to other nationals, seminars and other doggy functions. There are plenty of meeting rooms to hold our seminars in, as well as numerous banquet rooms of varying sizes. There are plenty of grassy areas around and through out the hotel complex for walking dogs. To add too the beautiful grounds, there is a lake in the center of the complex, also surrounded by grass. The hotel offers a free shuttle service within a 5 mile radius of the hotel that will take you to any numerous restaurants, stores and/or mall. In addition to this service, multiple shuttles will run people and dogs to and from the show grounds before, during and after the show each day at no charge, other than tipping the drivers. The hotel shuttles will run 24 hours a day. There are multiple hotels around the area with different price ranges that we will list for convenience prior to the show. Since the Red Lion is so close in proximity to all the CCA venues, it will be wonderful to not have to move to a new hotel after the agility and herding events have ended. The **Sacramento International Airport** is approximately 12 miles from the show site and the host hotel. All major airlines that allow dogs and different size crates fly into Sacramento. There are shuttle services to and from the host hotel to the airport that can be arranged. Other airports that the major airlines fly into within a 2 hour proximity are San Francisco International Airport, Oakland International Airport, San Jose International Airport and Reno/Tahoe International Airport.

Schedule of Events

1. **Herding** trials will be held March 18 and 19 at **Performance Dogs in Action**, located in Pleasant Grove, CA, which is less than 15 to 20 minutes from Cal Expo and the Red Lion, host hotel. There is a large area for parking and areas to set up for x-pens, crates, etc. There is also a Quonset hut on site, which includes electrical plugs to put together a lovely awards and photo area. We will be offering Course A and B, HT and PT sheep as well as course A and B, HT and PT ducks. http://www.performancedogsinaction.com

2. Agility trials will be held March 20 and 21^{st} at the Leone Equestrian Center, which is less than 20 minutes from Cal Expo and the Red Lion, host hotel. The building is a large indoor arena with an all-weather footing.

- 3. Conformation is planned for March 22, 2017 through March 25, 2017.
- 4. **Obedience and Rally** trials will be held on Wednesday, March 22, 2017 and Thursday, March 23, 2017.
- 5. Junior Showmanship will be held on Saturday, March 25, 2017.

We believe Sacramento has a lot to offer to the exhibitors. One of Sacramento's biggest attractions is **"Old Sacramento"** less than 5 minutes from the host hotel and is located on the Sacramento River. There are underground tours of the "original Sacramento", as well as shopping, dining, entertainment and so much more. Enjoy a horse drawn carriage ride around "Old Sac," or a Riverboat ride down the Sacramento River. Also located in Old Sacramento is the California State Railroad Museum that I would highly recommend everyone to attend. Other Sacramento attractions are the Crocker Art Museum, Sutter's Fort, the California Automobile Museum, the Sacramento History Museum and the California State Indian Museum. http://oldsacramento.com/

For the **wine lover enthusiasts** you have the beautiful wine country, Napa California, located close by. Napa is just 45 minutes from Sacramento and every major California wine grower is located there.

You also have Placerville, CA, just 30 minutes away from Sacramento. It is the gateway to the **Gold** Country where gold was discovered in California in 1848. It is also close to the home of the world-renowned Apple Hill country as well as more beautiful wine country.

Beautiful San Francisco is less than an hour and a half from Sacramento and is home to the beautiful **Golden Gate Bridge**, Chinatown, Alcatraz, pier 39 and numerous other attractions. This would be a fabulous day excursion for any exhibitor visiting the area.

Both have held multiple local collie club positions. We have a commitment of help from our Nor Cal Collie clubs, as well as multiple experienced collie folks.
